

YOUTH DIVISION - AG 5.06

DAIRY AND LIVESTOCK DIVISION

1. All exhibitors are required to furnish hay, bedding, grain and watering pails for livestock they exhibit
2. Open to all youth who have carefully selected, and kept accurate records of the calf entered for exhibition.
3. All purebred registered and I.D. Grade animals must meet breed association requirements and have registration papers or they will be considered as grade animals. All animals that qualify for District, State, or National shows must show as registered.
4. Check health regulations for papers needed.
5. Exhibitors are limited to 4 dairy or 4 beef animals; or any combination of dairy/beef not to exceed a total of 4.
6. **Cleaning Barns after Fair.** Each 4-H Club or FFA Chapter is responsible for cleaning their respective animal exhibit area after the fair. The barns must be cleaned by Monday 8 pm after the fair. All manure is to be dumped into the manure pits at the end of the barns. Exhibitors must receive approval from the St. Croix County Fair Association, Inc. if they intend to use a skid steer to clean their area. Exhibitors in the barns are to pull back the manure 3 feet from the barn walls or dividers before leaving Sunday night. If a Club/Chapter does not comply, the group will be assessed a \$100.00 clean-up charge to be paid to St. Croix County Fair, Inc. as well as a premium loss to exhibitors.
